Voting Absentee

The COVID -19 pandemic is moving us toward absentee voting. There are several options for obtaining information on how to vote absentee. On our Town of Spider Lake website there is information on how and where to obtain an absentee vote. You can also go to **MyVote.WI.Gov** and obtain one there. Two Referendums on April 7th Ballot

There are two referendums on your ballot for the April 7th election.

One is a state-wide referendum concerning ***rights of crime victims***. It will read; "Additional rights of crime victims. Shall section 9m of article I of the constitution, which gives certain rights to crime victims, be amended to give crime victims additional rights, to require that the rights of crime victims be protected with equal force to the protections afforded the accused while leaving the federal constitutional rights of the accused intact, and to allow crime victims to enforce their rights in court?"

A second referendum applies only to the Town of Spider Lake. It concerns ***changing the Town Clerk and Town Treasurer from elected positions to appointed positions***. I will be voting **NO**. I favor keeping these jobs in the hands of town residents; and, I want to retain my right to vote. Please see the reverse side of this page for a full discussion.
